# 5. <u>Delegations</u>

### 5.1 In-Support of Report CAO 12-2023

- 5.1.1 Shahid Khan, and Salvatore Provvidenza, Northland Power
  - S. Provvidenza, Senior Manager, Commercial Operations, Northland Power, appeared before Council to speak in support of Report CAO 12-2023. Topics of his presentation included the following:
    - Northland Power's corporate responsibility;
    - Ontario's monthly power demand;
    - Natural gas usage and its alignment with provincial and federal regulations;
    - Key project information, and project location map;
    - Project compliance with assessment and permit requirements;
    - Overview of leading sources of greenhouse gases and air pollutants, and project emissions; and
    - Overview of Northland Power's plan to displace natural gas with renewable natural gas.

- 5.1.2 Graham Guest, Niagara Renewable Natural Gas, Walker Industries
  - G. Guest, General Manager, Energy & Technical Services, Niagara Renewable Natural Gas, Walker Industries, appeared before Council to speak in support of Report CAO 12-2023. Topics of his presentation included the following:
    - Overview of gas produced in landfills;
    - Renewable Natural Gas ("RNG") overview; and
    - Walker Industries' RNG project.
- 5.1.3 Kurt Vos, Great Lakes Port Management Inc.
  - K. Vos, Commercial Leasing & Property Manager, Great Lakes Port Management Inc. was unable to attend and withdrew his request to delegate. Hey advised in writing of his support for the Northland Power proposal.

David DeLeeuw, General Manager, BMI Group/Bioveld Canada Inc. appeared before Council to speak in support of Report CAO 12-2023. Topics of his presentation included the following:

- The work of the BMI Group; and
- Northland Power's history as a good corporate citizen and responsible industrial neighbour to the BMI Group.

## 5.2 In-Opposition to Report CAO 12-2023

- 5.2.1 Jack Gibbons, Ontario Clean Air Alliance
  - J. Gibbons, Chair, Ontario Clean Air Alliance, appeared before Council to speak in opposition to Report CAO 12-2023. Topics of his presentation included the following:
    - The work of the Ontario Clean Air Alliance, including its current objective to phase out of gas-fired power plants;
    - Municipal support for the phase out of gas-fired power plants;
    - Provincial government plans to increase use of gas-fired power plants; and

 Alternative power options, including power management and renewable power sources.

### 5.2.2 Mark Freeman, Resident

- M. Freeman, Resident, appeared before Council to speak in opposition to Report CAO 12-2023. Topics of his presentation included the following:
  - Overview of climate change and its impacts;
  - Ontario's current energy plan, and how it will lead to increased emissions;
  - Alternative methods to meet provincial power needs;
  - Information concerning RNG offsets and fossil gas pollution; and
  - Canada's climate change accountability.

#### 5.2.3 John Hamilton, Resident

J. Hamilton, Resident, appeared before Council to speak in opposition to Report CAO 12-2023. He noted the impact fossil fuel emissions have on the environment, and advised of the need to halt the expansion of fossil fuel infrastructure.

#### 5.2.4 Don Morley, Resident

D. Morley, Resident, appeared before Council to speak in opposition to Report CAO 12-2023. He expressed his concern with air particulates in the Thorold South area surrounding the Northland Power site.

#### 5.2.5 Jordan Beekhuis, Resident

- J. Beekhuis, Resident, appeared before Council to speak in opposition to Report CAO 12-2023. Topics of his presentation included the following:
  - His education and work background in sustainable energy;
  - His support for RNG, and opposition to new gas plants;
  - The need for baseload energy expansion, rather than "peaker" energy expansion; and

• Cost considerations of the Northland Power proposal.
