9.1 Thorold Housing Group

Carrie Cottage, Resident and Business Owner, spoke about the work of the Thorold Housing Group (THG). She introduced the other members of the THG Housing Committee in attendance: Bill Vanderklippe, Resident and Business Owner, Terrance Schilstra, Pastor of The Table, Fred Neale, former Councillor, and Laurie Beach, Executive Director of Bethlehem Housing and Support.

Bill Vanderklippe presented on the following topics:

- The THG's Mandate
- Affordable housing needs in Niagara Region and Thorold
- The THG's recommendation that Council designate a City-owned plot of land, located on the north side of St. David's Road East, for development by THG; that the City enter into a long-term lease with the THG to fulfill this purpose; and, the City assist with the development of the property through reduction of permit fees and property taxes, and minimizing development obstacles.

Councillor D'Angela enquired if Staff could prepare a report to review development options for nearby properties. B. Vanderklippe advised that environmental assessments have been completed on the property on St. David's Road East, and THG has a partnership with an organization who can address identified issues.

Consumption Charge \$2.254 per cubic meter

7. That any surplus or deficit arising from 2023 sewer operations be transferred to/funded from the Sewage Capital Reserve.

- 8. That the rates be effective for any billing after March 21st.
- 9. That a review of the fees and charges be undertaken during 2023
- 10. That all other aspects of the 2023 Sewer Budget be approved.
- 11. That residents, in the urban service area, that have sewer service, but no water service, be charged the sewer rate based on the 2023 average water consumption of 200 cubic meters per year, and that this charge be placed on the 2023 final tax bill for these residents.
