

#### Subject: Emergency Over-Run – Repairs at 2 Carleton

Report to: Thorold City Council

### Recommendations

- 1. That repairs to 2 Carleton in the amount of \$1,636.94 (excluding HST) **BE APPROVED**.
- 2. That the emergency repair **BE FUNDED** as a General Budget over-run.

#### **Key Facts**

- Minor repairs were required at 2 Carleton to make the building a safe and habitable space for staff to work
- The building had been closed to the public for sometime, and was not maintained.

# **Budgetary Status**

There were no funds allocated in the 2024 budget for repairs to 2 Carleton therefore a request for funding in the amount of \$1,636.94 (Excluding HST) to complete minor repairs to 2 Carleton, as a general budget over-run.

# Analysis

During the move in by the Thorold Museum, items had been identified as needing repair or replacement. While the Museum was in the space as a regular tenant, it was discovered raccoons were living in the roof and needed to be professionally removed, as well as Carpenter Bees had begun to burrow into the soffit.
