The officer was the one who suggested to get it towed since we mentioned that the car hasn't moved in over two weeks.

There was nothing out of the ordinary about this tow and it was conducted legitimately. At this time no additional consideration will be given to this matter.



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

	s is a follow-up to the email I sent you last month regarding my 2008 Dodge Avenger being towed from in front of my current home, as a lease-holder. October 8th, our house made a call to bylaw regarding this specific car (pictures attached), partially blocking our driveway, and abandoned due to the condition. We even did the courtesy this time of speaking with our neighbors, who did not know who the vehicle longed to, unlike my roommates who told your officer they knew whose car mine was. you can tell from the attached pictures, one of the tires was completely flat, and the other three look as though they are about to come off the rim. This car was in worse shape than mine, and when we called in, we stated that we had spoken with the neighbors, and it they had no idea whose vehicle it was. We even mentioned that the car had been abandoned for about a week or two. aw came on October 10 th at around 2:30 in the afternoon, and three bylaw officers looked the vehicle over. Your officers left this vehicle a ticket, and gave them the courtesy of being able to move the vehicle into their driveway after the officers left. All the residents 22 Natalie Court are wondering why the law is not being enforced equally between households, especially considering the condition of this vehicle. I do not appreciate that my vehicle was towed, to which we can find no specific law or reason as to why it was, that eneighbors just got a ticket, and got to keep their vehicle. wondering in this specific situation what happened, why your officers took a soft, hands-off approach, and why this was handled differently compared to a vehicle being towed from in front of my property? Just curious what the double standard is here, that way if a nicle does this again, we can get it towed away from our property right away, so we can apply the law evenly.




